WHY GOD WANTS US TO PRAY

The importance of prayer is the message of Jesus to us in today's gospel reading. Our Lord told a parable of a widow who came before a dishonest judge day after day after day until finally he was so fed up that he finally gave her what she asked for.

Now, Jesus was not saying that God our Father is like a crooked judge who we need to pester. What Jesus is saying is that you and I must "pray always without becoming weary" and "call out to him day and night."

But why is this? If God already knows our needs, why do we need to tell him about them? And if we do tell him, why do we need to tell him more than once? What's the point in doing it again and again and again? If you're puzzled by questions like these, here are a few things to consider: First, persistence tests our faith, something that helps us grow and reminds us that we are dependent upon him, and not upon ourselves. Second, persistence teaches us patience, and reminds us of God's patience with us. Third, persistence honors the fact that God always acts in freedom and isn't a spigot of grace that we can turn on and off as we wish. Fourth, persistence tells God that some need is very near and dear to our hearts, and not just a passing fancy or a casual request. And fifth, persistence can make clear to us that God's agenda, and God's timetable, are sometimes very different than ours. Sometimes God says "Yes!" Sometimes God says, "Not yet." And sometimes God says "No."

We can have a hard time accepting the fact that God can say "No", especially when we think that what we're asking for is good and reasonable. We can be tempted to think that maybe God is deaf or that he just doesn't care. And we can begin to wonder if there's any real use in praying at all. But the fact remains that God doesn't grant us every wish. If He did, we'd begin to think that God is our servant, and forget that it is we who are the servants of God! God would be nothing more than a "genie in a bottle" or the proverbial "gumball machine." You know, put your quarter in, and get your candy out!

It's also important to remember that God isn't interested in making our lives easy. God is interested instead about making us holy- and there's certainly nothing easy about that! To shape us into holier people, God's will for us includes both difficult and painful things- something we need to keep in mind when God's answer is "No."

However, sometimes God says "No" because he's trying to get us to ask for something else! The famous Jesuit writer Fr. John Powell tells of having once been terribly nervous before a big speech he was to make. It was unusual for him to be so nervous because he gave big speeches all the time. So, he began to pray and pray that God would take his nervousness away. But nothing happened. Then he remembered a piece of advice he'd once been given: "If you keep asking God the same question and you don't get an answer, try another question!" So, he asked God as to why he was so nervous, and he wondered if there was something that God was trying to say to him.

And indeed, there was. In a moment of deep insight, God told Powell that he was too concerned with making a reputation for himself. Instead, what God wanted him to do was to love his listeners, not impress them. As Powell would later write: "I had been praying for the grace to show them how good I was. I should have been praying for the grace to love them."

One final thing: If we ask God for something, we need to be willing to let God use us to answer our own prayer. We can never say, "I'll ask God to take care of it, so I won't have to!" It doesn't work that way; prayer doesn't relieve us of responsibility. As one old joke goes, "If you pray to win the lottery, you first have to buy a ticket!" Or to paraphrase Pope Paul VI, if we pray for peace, we must work for justice. If you pray for a better marriage, you need to work at being a better partner; if you pray for your kids, work at being a better parent. In short, pray as if everything depends on God, and work as if everything depends on you!

The bottom line is that God won't give us everything we want. But he will give us everything we need. Yet he wants us to ask; he asks us to ask! In the words of St. Teresa of Avila, "God never gets tired of giving; so, let us never get tired of asking."

When hearing reports of the war in Ukraine, and the millions of Ukrainians that have been forced to flee their homeland, many have asked what they can do to help. Over 80,000 Ukrainians have already arrived in Canada through a special visa program created by Immigration Canada. An additional 500,000 have applied to the program and are expected to arrive in the coming months. Many are arriving to Toronto and are without family here in Canada to help them. Among those will be some who are vulnerable to human trafficking, particularly seniors, single women, and women with children. There is an immediate need for families to host for a period of between one and six months some of those who have arrived. 
