# EMBRACING OUR CALL TO MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP

In today's celebration of the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time, we gather as a faith community to reflect upon the profound call to mission that lies at the heart of our Christian identity. Inspired by the readings from 1 Thessalonians 1:1-5 and Matthew 22:15-21, we are reminded of the urgency and responsibility we have as followers of Christ to embrace the mission of spreading the Gospel to the ends of the earth.

The theme of today's liturgy, World Mission Sunday, invites us to contemplate the great commission that Jesus entrusted to His disciples and to all of us: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19). These words echo through the ages, urging us to be active participants in God's plan of salvation for all humanity.

The letter of St. Paul to the Thessalonians reminds us of the power of the Gospel to transform lives. Paul commends the Thessalonians for their faith and love, declaring, "We give thanks to God always for all of you, remembering you in our prayers, unceasingly calling to mind your work of faith and labor of love and endurance in hope" (1 Thessalonians 1:2-3).

Just as the Thessalonians received the Gospel not only in word but also in power, the same call resounds within our hearts today. We are called to be living witnesses of Christ's love, mercy, and joy in the world.

In the Gospel passage, we encounter a thoughtprovoking exchange between Jesus and the Pharisees. They sought to trap Jesus with a question about paying taxes, but His response transcended their expectations. Jesus said, "Render therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's" (Matthew 22:21). This powerful statement conveys a profound truth: while we have obligations to society, our ultimate allegiance belongs to God. The saints throughout history have exemplified the minit of minite planting behind a largery of ingniration

spirit of mission, leaving behind a legacy of inspiration and courage. St. Teresa of Calcutta once said, "I am a little pencil in the hand of a writing God, who is sending a love letter to the world." These words remind us that we too are instruments in God's hands, called to participate in His mission of love and compassion.

As we celebrate World Mission Sunday, let us reflect on our own vocation as missionary disciples. Each one of us has a unique role to play in building God's kingdom on earth. Whether it be through acts of kindness, sharing the Good News, or supporting mission work financially, we have the power to make a difference.

Let us take inspiration from the words of Pope Francis, who reminds us, "Mission is never the fruit of a perfectly planned program or a well-organized manual. Mission is always the fruit of a life which knows what it is to be found and healed, encountered and forgiven. Mission is born of a constant experience of God's merciful embrace" (Evangelii Gaudium, 45).

As we go forth from this sacred gathering, let us recommit ourselves to living as missionary disciples, joyfully sharing the love of Christ with all whom we encounter. May our actions, guided by the Holy Spirit, bear witness to the transformative power of the Gospel. Together, let us strive to make a tangible impact in our local communities and beyond, knowing that we are part of a global Church that transcends borders and embraces diversity.

In conclusion, let us respond to the call of World Mission Sunday with open hearts and a renewed sense of purpose. May we be emboldened by the examples of the saints and the words of Scripture, knowing that we are called to be the hands and feet of Christ in a world hungering for His love. Let us go forth, living out the mission entrusted to us, and may God's grace accompany us every step of the way.
