DISCIPLESHIP

One day, two guys, Frank and Bob were out fishing. A funeral procession passes by,

over the bridge they're fishing, and Bob takes off his hat and puts it over his chest. He does this until the funeral procession passes by. Frank then said "O Bob, I didn't know you had it in you! You are so respectful" Bob said, "It's the least I could do. After all I was married to her for 30 years."

Someone said, "A bad day of fishing is still better than a good day at the office"Some people just love to fish. They will give up anything. It can become an addiction. But in today's gospel we see a different group of men. They were fishermen. They loved fishing. But when Jesus said 'come, follow me', scripture says they immediately left their nets and followed him. They did not give it a second thought. Immediately they left everything behind, to follow Jesus. Immediately they left family and friends, to follow this man they had just met. Immediately they left their comfortable trade, which was probably making for them a comfortable living. They were professional fishermen and gave that all up, to follow Jesus, not knowing where they would go or what they would do to sustain their lives, but immediately they left and followed Jesus.

These were the first group of men Jesus chose to be with Him while doing His ministry on earth. They were not scholars, wealthy, and influential. They were just simple fishermen. Why did Jesus choose these fishermen? Many scholars pointed out that those who are good at fishing must possess certain qualities. **Patience**, **perseverance**, **and prudence**. Those qualities will make them equally good at fishers of people.

A fisherman must have patience to wait until the fish take the bait and perseverance not to be discouraged when there is no catch but always trying again. To become good fishers of men, the Disciples of Christ must not be discouraged when nothing seems to happen. A fisherman must know when to cast his nets. He knows that there are times when it is hopeless to catch fish. To become good fishers of people, the Disciples of Christ must be prudent in knowing, when to speak or when not to speak. There are times when people would accept what they are saying, and times when they would resist it.

We, the parents, teachers, priests are all called to become fishers of people. What are the traits and qualities that we possess to make us good fishers of people? Do we have the patience, perseverance, courage, prudence, faith and humility like that of the fishermen that Jesus called?

The story is told about a discouraged man who complained to his mother: "Mom, I stop going to church for two reasons: I don't like those people and those people don't like me." The mother looked at him and consoled him by saying: "My son, you should go back to church for two reasons: First, you're already fifty-five years old and second you are their pastor."

Parents, teachers, and priests, let us examine our own heart and our own life. Is it something that our children should look up to? How does their future look like when they look up to us? Are we good fishers of people? Do we have the patience and perseverance, courage and prudence, faith, and humility like that of the fishermen that Jesus called?
