SALT AND LIGHT

I heard of a Pastor who was making a wooden trellis to support a climbing vine. As he was pounding away, he noticed that a little boy was watching him. The boy didn't say a

word, so the pastor kept on working, thinking the boy would leave. But he didn't. Pleased at the thought that his work was being admired, the pastor finally said, "Are you trying to pick up some idea on gardening?" "No," he replied. "I'm just waiting to hear what a pastor says when he hits his thumb with a hammer." People are watching us! Children are observing us. What do they see? What they see, what they hear has an influence on them. And it should.

A young woman wrote a letter to her parents on their 50th wedding anniversary. "Dear loving Mom and Dad, I saw in you a thriving spirit. I saw you had strong self-esteem. I saw that you lived by convictions and priorities and not just by convenience, selfish pleasure, and financial gain. I felt the depth of love and concern as you listened to me and didn't judge me. You tried to understand me, you sympathized, and you celebrated with me, you demonstrated kindness and generosity - not just to me, but to other people as well. And you stood for something. You were willing to go against the grain of society and follow what you believed to be true, no matter what people said, and no matter how much it cost you. And for those reasons and a whole lot of others, I found myself really wanting what you had. Now, that I have a personal relationship with Christ, I wanted to tell you I'm grateful beyond words for how you lived out your Christian life in front of me".

Basically, she was telling her parents, thanks for being Contagious Christians. Jesus said, 'you are the salt and light'. Which means, Christianity is something which is meant to be tasted, experienced, and seen. Christianity should be perfectly visible to all. Our Christianity should be visible in the way we treat others.

Having said that, we should never forget that salt gives taste, but too much salt makes something taste rather horrible. We are the light of the world, but too much light blinds us to reality. Which means there should be some balance. Balance is the key. Balance is a virtue. As Christians, we are called to enact a tremendous balancing act, as we go through life. If we go too far in either direction, we risk doing more harm than good.

How do we find the balance? To be the salt and light, we don't have to be aggressive, forceful, nagging, annoying and sensational. We should be gentle, respectful, and sensitive.

Let the way we live, the things we say, and our attitude, add taste, and bring light within us and around us. Let the golden rule guide our life. "In everything do to others as you would have them do to you".

Do you like it when others get into your face and try to tell you what to believe? If you don't, then don't do it yourself. Do you appreciate it when people say one thing and then do something completely the opposite? Then don't do it. Do you like it when someone makes you laugh? Then make others laugh. If you want to be fed, then feed others. If you appreciate being loved, love others. When applying this rule, it makes us crawl into the skin of others. It makes us realize our words and our deeds do have an impact, and it hopefully spurs us towards enacting a more Christ-like approach- The one who called us to be salt and light.
