# RESPONDING TO THE LORD'S BANQUET: CLOTHED IN READINESS

Today, we gather as a community of faith to reflect upon the theme of readiness to respond to the call of the Lord's banquet with proper spiritual attire and disposition.

In the Gospel of Matthew (22:1-14), Jesus shares the parable of the wedding feast. We are reminded that God extends His invitation to all, but it is up to us to be prepared and properly attired to partake in this divine celebration. Just as the invited guests in the parable were expected to wear wedding garments, we too must clothe ourselves with spiritual readiness, humility, and love.

Saint Augustine once said, "You have made us for Yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they find rest in You." These words resonate deeply with the message of today's readings. Our restless hearts find their true peace and fulfillment when we respond to God's invitation with open and willing spirits, ready to feast upon the nourishment of His grace.

The call to readiness goes beyond merely adorning ourselves with physical attire; it encompasses our inner disposition as well. Saint Teresa of Ávila reminds us, "Christ has no body now but yours. No hands, no feet on earth but yours." This echoes the responsibility we have as Christians to prepare ourselves not only externally but also internally, cultivating virtues such as compassion, patience, forgiveness, and humility.

In the First Reading from the book of Isaiah (25:6-10a), we encounter the

beautiful image of God preparing a feast of rich foods and choice wines on His holy mountain. This imagery emphasizes the abundant blessings that await those who respond to His call. Let us take these words to heart and reflect on the ways we can grow in our readiness to receive and share the goodness of God's banquet with others.

As we gather for Mass today, let us examine our hearts and renew our commitment to be clothed in readiness, both in our external actions and internal disposition. May we respond eagerly to God's invitation, seeking His guidance and grace to live lives that reflect the love and joy of His kingdom.

In conclusion, let us remember the words of Saint Paul in his letter to the Philippians (4:13): "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." With Christ as our source of strength and inspiration, let us embrace the call to readiness and approach the Lord's banquet with hearts aflame, ready to experience the abundant blessings and joy that await us.




