REJOICE AND SPREAD THE LIGHT OF HOPE

As we gather on this blessed Third Sunday of Advent, known as Gaudete Sunday or Rejoice Sunday, our hearts are filled with anticipation and joy.

We are called to rejoice and embrace the light of hope that illuminates our lives. Today, we are reminded that even amidst challenges, we can find joy in the anticipation of Christ's coming.

In the first reading, the prophet Isaiah proclaims, "The spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me; he has sent me to bring glad tidings to the poor, to heal the broken-hearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives and release to the prisoners."
