"FOLLOW ME, AND I WILL MAKE YOU FISHERS OF PEOPLE." MARK 1:17

In today's Gospel, we encounter the powerful call of Jesus to his disciples.

This call is not simply a beckoning, but a transformation—a transformation that beckons each of us today. As we reflect on the readings of this Fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time, let us ponder the profound implications these words hold for our lives.




