JESUS HEALS

On the 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B, we are called to reflect on the profound messages conveyed through the Scripture readings of the day.

In the first reading from the Book of Leviticus, we are reminded of the importance of purity and holiness in our lives. As stated in Leviticus 13:1-2, 45-46, "The one who bears the sore of leprosy shall keep his garments rent and his head bare, and shall muffle his beard; he shall cry out, 'Unclean, unclean!' As long as the sore is on him he shall declare himself unclean, since he is unclean. He shall dwell apart, making his abode outside the camp."

This reading challenges us to examine our own lives and question whether we are living in accordance with God's commandments and striving for spiritual purity. Just as the leper had to declare himself unclean, we too must acknowledge our imperfections and sins before God, seeking His forgiveness and grace.

In the second reading from the First Letter to the Corinthians, we are reminded that our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, and we are urged to honor God with our bodies. This serves as a powerful reminder of the sacredness of our existence and the responsibility we have to treat ourselves and others with dignity and respect.

In the Gospel reading from Mark 1:40-45, we encounter the powerful story of Jesus healing a leper. Despite societal norms and expectations, Jesus shows compassion and reaches out to touch the untouchable, demonstrating His boundless love and mercy for all. This act of healing not only physically restores the leper but also symbolizes the

spiritual healing that Jesus offers to each one of us.

As St. Augustine once said, "God has promised forgiveness to your repentance, but He has not promised tomorrow to your procrastination." This reminds us of the urgency to seek reconciliation with God and to turn away from sin today, not waiting for a tomorrow that may never come. Let us strive to emulate the faith of the leper who approached Jesus with humility and trust, believing in His power to heal and transform lives.

Therefore, as we meditate on the readings of this day, let us be inspired to seek spiritual purity, to acknowledge our need for healing and forgiveness, and approach God with faith and humility. May we be reminded that no matter how broken or unclean we may feel, Jesus is always ready to reach out to us with love, compassion, and the promise of renewal. Let us embrace this message and strive to live each day in accordance with God's will, spreading His light and love to all those we encounter.
