#### A CALL TO RENEWAL

On this Fifth Sunday of Lent, as we journey closer to the solemn celebration of Easter, let us reflect deeply on the readings appointed for today. In the Gospel of John (12:20-33), Jesus speaks of the grain of wheat that must fall to the ground and die in order to bear much fruit. This powerful metaphor reminds us of the sacrificial nature of Christ's mission and invites us to consider our own willingness to die to self in order to bring forth abundant life in Christ.

As we ponder these words, let us also contemplate the words of Saint Paul in his letter to the Hebrews (5:7-9), where he speaks of Christ's obedience and his suffering, which ultimately led to his glorification. Through his obedience, Christ became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him. This challenges us to reflect on our own obedience to God's will and our willingness to embrace the crosses in our lives, knowing that through them, we too can share in Christ's glory.

In this Lenten season, I urge all parishioners to participate in the Lenten retreats on March 18th and 19th, where we can take time to reflect on our spiritual journey and draw closer to God. The opportunity for Lenten Confession on the 19th beginning at 5:00 pm, is a chance for us to experience the healing and forgiveness that God offers us. Let us not let this holy season pass by without taking advantage of these grace-filled moments.

Let us heed the words of the prophet Jeremiah (31:31-34), who speaks of the new covenant that God will make with his people, a covenant of forgiveness and mercy. As we approach the sacrament of Confession, let us open our hearts to receive God's grace and allow ourselves to be renewed and transformed by his love.

As we continue our Lenten journey, may we be inspired by the example of Christ, who willingly laid down his life for us, and may we strive to imitate his obedience and selflessness in our own lives. Let us embrace the crosses that we bear, knowing that through them, we can experience the joy of resurrection and share in Christ's eternal glory.

In the words of Saint Augustine, "God loves each of us as if there were only one of us." Let us take comfort in the knowledge of God's infinite love for us and allow it to guide us on our journey of faith. May this Fifth Sunday of Lent be a time of profound spiritual renewal and transformation for each of us. Amen.

# This weekend is ShareLife Sunday!


ShareLife Sunday marks the first collection for our parish's annual campaign.
