### LOVE AND UNITY

On the Fifth Sunday of Easter, Year B, the readings call us to reflect on the theme of love and unity in the Christian community. In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 9:26-31), we see how Saul, who persecuted Christians, is now accepted by the disciples because of Barnabas' advocacy. This passage highlights the transformative power of love and forgiveness in building harmonious relationships within the Church.

In the second reading from the First Letter of John (1 John 3:18-24), we are reminded of the commandment to love one another. Love is not just a feeling but requires concrete actions. By loving genuinely and sacrificially, we abide in God and God in us, creating a bond of unity that transcends all differences.

The Gospel reading from John (John 15:1-8) presents the metaphor of Jesus as the vine and his followers as the branches. Just as branches draw life from the vine, we must remain connected to Christ to bear fruit. This passage emphasizes the importance of staying rooted in Christ through prayer, Scripture, and the sacraments to live a fruitful Christian life.

In today's world, characterized by division, materialism, and self-centeredness, these readings offer a powerful message of unity, love, and spiritual nourishment. As St. John Chrysostom said, "What is more beneficial

than love? It dispels all that is contrary to it." Thus, we are called to love one another, forgive as we have been forgiven, and remain deeply connected to Christ, the source of all grace and strength.

To live out the Gospel message, we can start by practicing forgiveness, showing compassion to those in need, and prioritizing our relationship with God through prayer and sacraments. By nurturing our spiritual connection to Christ, we can bear fruits of love, joy, and peace in our daily lives, becoming beacons of light in a world that longs for unity and authentic Christian witness.


