

EMBRACING THE BREAD OF LIFE: A CALL TO FAITH AND COMMUNITY

As we gather on this 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time, we reflect on the profound themes of commitment, community, and divine sustenance. The readings for today invite us to consider our choices, the nature of our relationships, and the ultimate source of life itself.

A Choice for God

In our first reading from the Book of Joshua (24:1-2a, 15-17, 18b), we witness a pivotal moment in the history of Israel. Joshua gathers the tribes and challenges them to choose whom they will serve: "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." This declaration echoes through the ages, inviting us to make a conscious decision about our faith. Today, we too are invited to choose. In an era filled with distractions and competing ideologies, the call to serve the Lord remains as relevant as ever.

Joshua's reminder prompts us to reflect on our daily choices and the influences that shape our lives. Are we following the Lord, or are we swayed by the prevailing currents of the culture around us? Our lives can often mirror the Israelites, who faced the temptation to worship foreign gods. The choices we make—whether in our families, workplaces, or communities—should reflect our commitment to God and to one another.

The Taste of Life

The Gospel reading from John (6:53, 60-69) brings us to the heart of our faith—the Eucharist. Jesus proclaims, "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you." These challenging words prompted many to turn away, unable to accept the reality of divine sustenance through the Eucharist. Yet, for those of us who remain, like Peter, we recognize that Jesus has the words of eternal life.

In our current life situations—the Eucharist provides a source of hope and strength. It is a reminder that in every moment of our lives, we are invited to partake of the Bread of Life, which nourishes us and unites us as a community. As St. Teresa of Avila beautifully stated, "Prayer is an act of love." When we approach the altar, we engage in a profound act of love, both for God and for each other.

Living in Forgiveness and Love

Our second reading from Ephesians (4:32-5:21-32) challenges us to embody the love and forgiveness that Christ exemplified. "Be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you." Forgiveness is not merely a suggestion; it is a necessity for the health of our communities and our souls.

In practical terms, this means examining our relationships—our families, our friendships, and our parish community. Are we fostering environments of love, understanding, and grace? Or are we allowing misunderstandings and grievances to fester? As we reflect on our lives, let us remember the words of St. Francis of Assisi: "It is in giving that we receive." By extending forgiveness and kindness, we not only mirror Christ's love but also open ourselves to receiving that same love in abundance.

A Community of Witness

As we navigate our faith journey, let us remember that we do not walk alone. We are part of a vibrant community at St. John Vianney, called to witness to the love of Christ in our lives. Our actions, our choices, and our very presence in this community are a testament to our faith.

In conclusion, let us heed the words of Joshua and choose to serve the Lord wholeheartedly. Let us partake of the Eucharist with reverence and gratitude, recognizing it as our source of life. And let us commit to living out the Gospel through kindness, compassion, and forgiveness.
