

A CALL TO AUTHENTIC LIVING

On this 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, the readings remind us of the importance of living authentically in our faith and the transformative power of God's Word in our lives.

In the first reading from the book of Deuteronomy, Moses urges the Israelites to cling to the commandments given to them, emphasizing that obedience to God's law leads to wisdom and understanding. He states, "You must neither add anything to what I command you nor take away anything from it." This call to fidelity and integrity resonates deeply in our contemporary world, where distractions and distortions of truth often lead us astray.

The Psalm (Psalm 15) beautifully complements this message, highlighting the qualities of those who dwell in God's presence: "Lord, who may abide in your tent? Who may dwell on your holy hill?" It reminds us that a true life of faith is marked by righteousness, integrity, and the courage to stand firm in our convictions.

In the second reading from James, we are reminded that "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above." This passage calls us to recognize the blessings in our lives and the responsibility that comes with them. Faith is not just a matter of hearing the Word but acting upon it. St. James challenges us to be "doers of the word, and not merely hearers," inviting us to live out our faith actively in our daily lives.

In the Gospel of Mark, Jesus confronts the Pharisees about their focus on external rituals rather than the internal purity of the heart. He reminds us that what truly defiles a person comes from within. "It is from within, from the human heart, that evil intentions come." This radical teaching urges us to cultivate our inner

lives and to prioritize love, compassion, and integrity over mere tradition or appearances.

The readings inspire us to seek a deeper relationship with God. They encourage us to reflect on our intentions and engage authentically with the world around us. As we go through this week, let us commit to living out our faith authentically, allowing God's Word to transform our hearts. True faith is a journey that starts within us and flows outward to touch the lives of those around us.

Let us pray for one another that we may be vessels of God's love and truth in the world.
