# HOMILY OF HIS GRACE MOST REVEREND FRANCIS LEO METROPOLITAN ARCHBISHOP OF TORONTO STEWARDSHIP SUNDAY 22 SEPTEMBER 2024

Brothers and Sisters in the Lord,

Today, we celebrate Stewardship Sunday across the Archdiocese of Toronto. I welcome this opportunity to speak with you briefly about an important aspect of our lives as Christians, about how we express our faith both individually and as a Church, and how we live our convictions in a world that does not always understand what it means to be loved by God and actively pursue His purpose in our lives. I am speaking about stewardship and how it constitutes the path to authentic Christian living and holiness.

We gather as a community of believers and worshipers, disciples and witnesses of the Risen Christ. We desire to be in right relationship with the Lord—a relationship that is deep, personal, transformative, and redemptive. It is a life of faith and trust that colours our daily living. We want to know Him better, serve His Kingdom faithfully, and be with Him forever when our earthly journey ends. As pilgrims, we interact with many people and are invited to love and serve with the very love of Christ—even to love our enemies. This requires that we grow in His love, in virtue, and in service.

Stewardship is about this growth—in love, virtue, and service. It is about fostering an awareness of God, who calls us to abide in His presence daily, witness, and show His face to our wounded humanity. Stewardship is a crucial process, an inner attitude, and a multi-faceted approach that leads to a humble recognition of who we are, who God is, and what He desires to accomplish through and around us.

Perhaps you have never heard stewardship described as a process or way of living our Catholic faith. In the past, we often heard of stewardship in terms of sharing gifts, using our talents and resources in service of God and the community. While that is true and essential, it is not the whole story. Stewardship is more than a one-time act of giving; it is a dynamic transformation and a way of being Catholic. It is a commitment that changes life and changes lives. It is a fundamental disposition of the heart, mind, and will that strives to uncover the riches and mystery of God and serve His greater purpose for our lives.

Clarifying what true greatness is, Jesus reminds His disciples in today's Gospel: "Whoever

wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all." This is the royal way, the road to the Kingdom, and the life of every authentic believer. When we see our faith as an organic growth in Christlikeness—endeavouring to imitate Him, love like Him, and serve like Him—we are true stewards of His mysteries, living stewardship in its fullest meaning. This could be as simple as inviting someone to Mass, praying the rosary, standing up for the voiceless, or bringing the Eucharist to a shut-in.

In a delightful passage of his apostolic Letter on St. Joseph, Patris Corde, With a Father's heart, Pope Francis explains how we are invited to give not just something but our very selves. Joseph found happiness in self-gift, not self-sacrifice. Pope Francis writes, "Our world rejects those who confuse authority with authoritarianism, service with servility...Every true vocation is born of the gift of oneself, which is the fruit of mature sacrifice." Whatever our vocation, our self-gift will not be fulfilled if it stops at sacrifice—it must become a sign of the joy of love."

Stewardship, therefore, emerges as a divine and human endeavour, a means of sanctification, and a way of glorifying God. Self-sacrifice is part of the equation, but it leads to the serene gift of our lives for the Lord and for others. It is this self-gift that allows grace to flow through our witness into the hearts and lives of others, transforming our communities.

As we celebrate our Eucharistic and Risen Lord Jesus today, on Stewardship Sunday, I encourage you to reflect on how we are growing in love, virtue, and service. Let us seek ways to go beyond necessary sacrifices and embrace the deeper call to give ourselves fully, just as Christ did.
