2024 MESSAGE FOR OCTOBER: MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY AND OF THE MISSIONS

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

May Jesus and Mary be in your souls.

May Jesus and Mary dwell in your souls. This October brings us great joy as we reflect on two essential dimensions of Catholic life: devotion to Our Lady through the Rosary and the Church's missionary work.

The Rosary has been a cherished prayer, offering comfort and strength throughout history. Its origins are linked to the victory at Lepanto on October 7, 1571, through Our Lady's intercession. Saints like St. Dominic, Pope Leo XIII, and countless others have promoted this timeless devotion. I urge you to meditate on Pope St. John Paul II's 2002 Apostolic Letter, The Rosary of the Virgin Mary, to deepen your understanding of how Our Lady leads us to Christ. As the Pope reminds us, "With the Rosary, the Christian
