SERVANT LEADERSHIP: THE PATH TO TRUE GREATNESS

On this 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time, the readings invite us to reflect on the true meaning of leadership and sacrifice in the eyes of God.

In **Isaiah 53:10-11**, we see a prophecy about the Servant, foreshadowing Suffering Christ's sacrifice on the cross. Though it was the will of the Lord to crush him, it also led to salvation for many. This paradox of suffering leading to triumph can help us understand the value of our own trials. When we encounter difficultieswhether in family life, work, or personal struggles-it is essential to remember that God can bring grace and healing through our sacrifices. As St. John Vianney once said, "The cross gave peace to the world; it must bring peace to our hearts too."

Psalm 33 reminds us of the steadfast love of the Lord, a love that delivers those who put their hope in Him. In times of uncertainty, we are reminded to trust not in our own strength but in God's unfailing providence.

In **Hebrews 4:14-16**, we are reminded that Jesus, our High Priest, empathizes with our weaknesses. He was tested as we are, yet without sin. This gives us the courage to approach the throne of grace with confidence, seeking mercy and help in times of need.

In the **Gospel of Mark 10:42-45**, Jesus overturns worldly notions of greatness. He tells his disciples, "Whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be the slave of all." In a world that often prizes ambition and self-promotion, Christ offers a counter-cultural message: true greatness is found in humble service. Whether we are parents, teachers, leaders, or employees, we are called to put the needs of others before our own. Mother Teresa said, "Not all of us can do great things, but we can do small things with great love."

As we go forth this week, let us be thankful for the ways in which we can serve, remembering the words of St. Francis of Assisi: "It is in giving that we receive." May we seek not our own

advancement, but the good of others, trusting that God will reward us with His peace and grace.

The readings today remind us that true greatness lies in service, humility, and trust in God's will. Jesus, our High Priest, knows our weaknesses and invites us to confidently approach Him for help. As we live out these teachings, let us embrace the call to be servant-leaders, following Christ's example of love and sacrifice in our daily lives.
