A MESSAGE OF PEACE AND HEALING

Today, as we gather for the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time, we also unite our hearts on this special Day of Prayer for Peace. The call for peace is central to our readings today, revealing God's unwavering commitment to heal and restore His people—a message that resonates powerfully in our world filled with division, anxiety, and longing for harmony.

In Jeremiah 31:7-9, we hear the Lord's promise to bring His people back from exile. "I will gather them from the farthest parts of the earth," God declares, emphasizing His unending love and desire for reconciliation. This echoes deeply with our current global context, where many are displaced and seeking refuge. As a parish, we are called to respond with compassion and welcome, embodying the hope that God offers to all, especially those marginalized in our communities.

In Hebrews 5:1-6, we hear about Christ as our high priest, chosen to mediate between humanity and God. This passage reminds us of our own call to serve others, particularly those in need. Jesus, who "offered up prayers and supplications with loud cries and tears," exemplifies the importance of intercession and compassion. May we take this call to heart, standing in solidarity with those who suffer and advocating for justice in our communities.

The Gospel of Mark 10:46-52 presents the story of Bartimaeus, a blind beggar who cries out for Jesus' mercy. His unwavering faith leads to his healing: "Go; your faith has made you well." Bartimaeus' story challenges us to examine our own blindness—what prevents us from seeing the needs of those around us? How can we be agents of healing in our families, workplaces, and neighborhoods? As we pray for peace, let us remember that peace often begins with understanding and compassion, which can be achieved through faith in action.

As we reflect on these scriptures today, let us embrace our roles as peacemakers in a world that desperately needs healing. Remember the words of St. Francis of Assisi: "Where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith."

May we leave this place renewed in our commitment to live out our faith boldly, fostering peace in our hearts and extending it to our communities.


Are you relatively new here at St. John Vianney? If you started attending our church in 2022, 2023 or 2024 our parish wants to share an official "Hello." Please set aside
