"LOVE OF GOD AND NEIGHBOR: THE HEART OF OUR FAITH"

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength." (Mark 12:30)

In this Sunday's readings, we are reminded of the core of our faith: the call to love God fully and to extend that love to our neighbor. The passage from *Deuteronomy 6:2-6*highlights the ancient commandment to love God above all else—a teaching that was central to the Jewish faith and is foundational to our Christian identity. This wholehearted devotion is not only an outward practice but an inward orientation of our lives toward God, the source of all love.

In the Gospel, *Mark* 12:28-34, Jesus unites the commandment to love God with the commandment to love one's neighbor as oneself, revealing that the two are inseparable. To truly love God means we cannot ignore the needs, dignity, or struggles of those around us. As St. John tells us, "Whoever does not love a brother or sister whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen" (1 John 4:20).

The Letter to the Hebrews 7:23-28 speaks of Christ's eternal priesthood, emphasizing that Jesus intercedes for us with a love that knows no limits. His sacrifice was not a mere ritual; it was the ultimate act of love that binds us to God and to each other. In His example, we see that loving God and neighbor is not a momentary feeling but a lifelong commitment.

Dear friends, Loving God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength invites us to bring our faith into every area of our lives. Whether in our work, relationships, or personal choices, we are challenged to ask: "Is this rooted in love for God and others?" Practically, this love might mean being present for someone in need, offering forgiveness, or giving time and resources to support those who are less fortunate.

Loving our neighbor today requires intentionality. It can be as simple as greeting a stranger, checking on

someone lonely, or standing up for justice. In our increasingly divided world, Jesus' command calls us to actively look for ways to bridge divides, to see others through a lens of compassion, and to treat every person with dignity.

The readings this Sunday remind us that love—of God and of neighbor—is the greatest commandment. This love is not merely a feeling but a choice we make daily, a foundation on which we build our actions and attitudes. As we go forth, may we renew our commitment to let love guide our lives, trusting that in loving others, we draw nearer to God, who is love itself.
