My Dear Brothers and Sisters, Praised be Jesus Christ.

Christmas offers us a blessed opportunity to reflect on the immense love of God, made manifest in the mystery of the Incarnation. The birth of Jesus, the Prince of Peace, fulfills the promise of the Annunciation and reveals God's unconditional love, bringing hope and joy to our lives. The Word became flesh (cf. Jn 1:14-18), scattering the darkness of sin and filling our hearts and communities with light and newness of life.

Jesus Christ, though eternal and one with the Father, chose to descend into our wounded world, born of the Virgin Mary in Bethlehem. He became one of us, walking among us as our friend, brother, teacher, and Savior. Why did He do this?

1. **To Save Us and Reconcile Us to God** (cf. CCC 457). Sin alienates us from God, yet Jesus came to rescue us from darkness and death. At Christmas, let us humbly acknowledge our sins and embrace the saving love of Christ.

2. **To Reveal God's Love** (cf. CCC 458). God's response to our rejection was love, never abandonment. His infinite love reaches out to us, offering us another chance to be embraced by His mercy. How do we welcome and share this love?

3. **To Be Our Model of Holiness** (cf. CCC 459). Jesus shows us the path to holiness, calling us to imitate Him in daily life. Are we striving for holiness, convinced of our call to become saints?

4. **To Make Us Children of God** (cf. CCC 460). Through Jesus, we are adopted into God's family and called to partake in His divine nature. Do we live in gratitude for this grace, especially through the sacraments?

This Christmas coincides with the Jubilee Year of "**Pilgrims of Hope**," a time of renewal proclaimed by Pope Francis. On Christmas Eve, the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica will be opened, inaugurating this special year. On December 29, I will celebrate Mass at St. Michael's Cathedral Basilica, joining bishops worldwide in proclaiming the hope and love of Christ. I invite you to join us in prayer and witness to this unity in faith.

As you celebrate Christmas with Mass, meals, and the exchange of gifts, remember that Jesus, born in a humble manger, is the greatest gift of all. Let us become gifts of love, reconciliation, and peace to those around us.
