# "MANIFESTING GOD'S GLORY THROUGH OUR LIVES"

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This Sunday's readings invite us to witness the transformative power of God's love and the ways in which He works through His people to reveal His glory. From Isaiah's prophetic vision of God's delight in His people, to St. Paul's teaching on spiritual gifts, and the miraculous event at the wedding in Cana, the Scriptures remind us that God's presence is ever active in our lives, calling us to share His love and joy with others.

### First Reading: Isaiah 62:1-5

The prophet Isaiah assures us of God's unrelenting love for His people. "You shall be called by a new name that the mouth of the Lord will give... for the Lord delights in you" (Isaiah 62:2-4). This passage speaks of a divine promise: God does not abandon His people but works tirelessly for their salvation. Israel, once seen as forsaken, is now crowned with dignity and joy, likened to a bride in whom God delights.

This is a reminder for us that no matter how forsaken or insignificant we may feel, God calls us to a new name, a renewed identity in His love. As St. Teresa of Avila said, "What a great favor God does to those He places in the company of good people! "Let us open our hearts to this love and trust in His transforming grace.

### Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:4-11

St. Paul highlights the diversity of spiritual gifts within the community. "To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good" (1 Corinthians 12:7). These gifts—wisdom, knowledge, faith, healing, and more—are not for personal glory but to build up the Body of Christ.

This reading challenges us to recognize our own gifts and those of others. Whether you are a teacher, caregiver, or someone who serves behind the scenes, your role is vital. In our parish, this diversity is evident in ministries like youth outreach, care for the homebound, and our children's sacramental programs. Let us celebrate and use our gifts for God's glory, knowing that even small acts of love can make a big impact.

### Gospel: John 2:1-12

The wedding at Cana is the first of Jesus' signs, revealing His glory and deep compassion for human needs. When the wine runs out, Mary intercedes, telling the servants, "Do whatever he tells you" (John 2:5). Jesus responds with an abundance far beyond expectation—transforming water into the finest wine.

This miracle teaches us two profound truths. First, God is deeply concerned about the details of our lives, even the seemingly mundane. Second, transformation is possible when we entrust our needs to Him. Reflect on your own life: what "empty jars" do you bring to Jesus? Whether it's strained relationships, worries about health, or the challenges of daily life, trust that He can fill them with His grace and joy.

As Mary showed at Cana, our faith and cooperation matter. St. Augustine reminds us, "God who created you without you will not save you without you." Let us, like Mary, surrender to God's will and invite Him into every aspect of our lives.

### **Practical Reflections for Our Lives**

- 1. **Delight in God's Love**: Take time this week to reflect on how God delights in you. Spend a moment in prayer, thanking Him for the ways He calls you to new life.
- 2. **Celebrate Your Gifts**: What gifts has the Holy Spirit given you? How can you use them to serve our parish and community? Consider joining or supporting a ministry.
- 3. **Bring Your Needs to Jesus**: Think about a personal challenge or an area in your life where you need transformation. Bring this to God in prayer and trust in His providence.

### A Call to Joy and Action

As a parish, let us follow Mary's example by being attentive to the needs of others and bringing them to Jesus. Whether through acts of service, prayer, or support, we are called to manifest His love in our homes, workplaces, and community.

Let us also keep in mind the words of Pope Francis: "Joy adapts and changes, but it always endures, even as a flicker of light born of our personal certainty that, when everything is said and done, we are infinitely loved."

May this week be an opportunity for all of us to experience God's delight and share His joy with others.
