### SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD

This Sunday, the Church celebrates the *Sunday of the Word of God*, instituted by Pope Francis in 2019 to emphasize the importance of Scripture in our lives. It is a day to reflect on the beauty and power of God's Word, which enlightens, guides, and strengthens us in our journey of faith. As the Holy Father reminds us, "A Christian's life is marked by the decisive encounter with Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh, and the Holy Scriptures are the book through which we constantly deepen our relationship with Him."

Our readings this Sunday beautifully highlight the transformative power of God's Word and call us to embrace it with open hearts and minds.

### First Reading: Nehemiah 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10

In our first reading, we find the people of Israel gathered to hear the Book of the Law being read aloud by Ezra. The scene is profound: men, women, and children stand in reverence, listening attentively. As they hear God's Word, they are moved to tears, recognizing their need for renewal and God's mercy. Yet, Ezra encourages them not to weep but to rejoice, saying, "The joy of the Lord is your strength."

This passage reminds us that God's Word is not meant to burden us but to bring us joy and transformation. It invites us to approach Scripture with reverence, knowing that in it, we encounter the living God who desires to renew our hearts and give us strength.

### Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:12-30

St. Paul, in his letter to the Corinthians, presents the beautiful image of the Church as the Body of Christ. He reminds us that we are all part of one body, each with unique gifts and roles to fulfill. "If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honoured, all rejoice together with it."

This message is especially relevant in our parish community. Each of us has a role to play—whether in ministry, service, or prayer. When we recognize and appreciate our gifts and those of others, we build a stronger, more united community. Let us ask ourselves: How am I contributing to the Body of Christ? Am I supporting my fellow parishioners in their spiritual journey?

### Gospel: Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21

In today's Gospel, Jesus stands in the synagogue of Nazareth and reads from the scroll of Isaiah, proclaiming, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me... He has sent me to bring good news to the poor." He boldly declares that this prophecy is fulfilled in their hearing. This moment marks the beginning of Jesus' public ministry—a ministry of healing, liberation, and hope.

Jesus' mission is not just a historical event; it is ongoing in our lives today. He speaks to us through Scripture, calling us to be instruments of His Good News in our families, workplaces, and communities. As St. Jerome famously said, "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ." This Sunday, let us renew our commitment to immersing ourselves in the Word of God and living it out in practical ways.

### **Practical Reflections for Our Lives**

- **1.** <u>Make Scripture a Daily Companion:</u> Set aside time each day to read and reflect on the Bible. Even a few minutes can bring clarity, strength, and peace.
- **2.** <u>Live the Word:</u> Let Scripture inspire your actions—whether through kindness, forgiveness, or service to others.
- **3.** Share the Word: Encourage family members and friends to explore the Scriptures, perhaps by joining a Bible study or reflecting together on Sunday's readings.
- **4.** Find Joy in God's Word: Like the people in Nehemiah's time, allow God's message to fill you with hope and strength, even amid life's challenges.

As we celebrate this *Sunday of the Word of God*, may we rediscover the joy and wisdom found in Scripture and allow it to shape our hearts and lives. Let us echo the words of the Psalmist: "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." (Psalm 119:105)

May the Word of God continue to inspire and guide us as we walk together in faith.
