SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT MARCH 16, 2025

As we continue our Lenten journey, this Second Sunday of Lent brings us to the mountaintop of the Transfiguration. From the darkness of sacrifice to the brilliance of Christ's glory, we see a glimpse of the promise that awaits us if we remain faithful.

A Covenant of Faith and Trust

Our First Reading (Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18) takes us back to Abraham, our father in faith. God asks him to look at the stars, a vision of the countless generations that will come from him. Yet, Abraham and Sarah are still childless. How could this promise be fulfilled? But Abraham believes, and "the Lord reckoned it to him as righteousness" (Gen 15:6). God then seals His promise with a sacred covenant, an unbreakable bond of divine faithfulness.

This passage reminds us that God's promises are not always fulfilled in the ways we expect, but they are always true. When we struggle with uncertainty, when prayers seem unanswered, we are called like Abraham to trust in God's timing. Lent is our time to renew that trust, surrendering our fears to the One who never fails us.

Citizens of Heaven: Where Is Our True Home?

In the Second Reading (Philippians 3:20—4:1), St. Paul reminds us: "Our citizenship is in heaven." This is a powerful statement in a world that often defines us by nationality, status, or success. But Paul invites us to lift our eyes beyond the temporary and to anchor our hearts in eternity.

Too often, we become fixated on earthly concerns: finances, careers, social pressures; forgetting that our ultimate calling is to be with God. This is why Lent is so vital: it refocuses us on what truly matters. Paul exhorts us to "stand firm in the Lord" (Phil 4:1), resisting the temptations that pull us away from our heavenly calling.

The Transfiguration: A Glimpse of Glory in the Midst of Struggle

The Gospel (Luke 9:28b-36) brings us to Mount Tabor, where Jesus is transfigured before Peter, James, and John. His face shines like the sun, His garments become dazzling white, and Moses and Elijah appear beside Him. Then comes the voice from the cloud: "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to Him!"

What is the meaning of this profound moment? Jesus had just told His disciples that He would suffer and die. The Transfiguration, then, is God's reassurance that suffering is not the final word. Before Jesus endures the agony of the Cross, the Father reveals His divine glory.

This is a message for all of us. There are times in life when we face trials, illness, grief, doubt, or failure. But like the disciples, God gives us moments of clarity, glimpses of His love and presence, so that we may press on in faith. We need those "mountaintop moments": times of prayer, grace, and spiritual renewal, to strengthen us for the journey ahead.

"Listen to Him!" - A Call to Silence and Prayer

The Father's command, "Listen to Him," is an urgent Lenten invitation. Do we truly listen to Christ? Or are we too distracted by the noise of our daily lives?

- In our prayer life: Do we take time to be still and hear God's voice? Silence is the language of God.
- In our relationships: Do we listen with love, or do we react in haste? True listening fosters healing and understanding.
- In our moral choices: Do we listen to the voice of Christ in our conscience, or do we follow what is convenient?

St. Teresa of Calcutta once said, "God speaks in the silence of the heart. Listening is the beginning of prayer." This Lent, let us cultivate the habit of listening to God, to one another, and to the needs of those around us.

Living the Transfiguration in Daily Life

How do we take the Transfiguration from the mountain into our daily lives?

- 1. **Stay close to Christ in prayer**: Prayer transforms us. Just as Jesus prayed before His Transfiguration, we, too, are changed when we spend time with Him.
- 2. **See Christ in others:** In the poor, the suffering, the lonely can we recognize the face of Christ shining through them?
- 3. **Live with hope**: Like Abraham, trust in God's promises. Like Paul, remember that our citizenship is in heaven. Like Peter, James, and John, do not let fear keep you from following Christ.

As we continue through Lent, let us take the Father's words to heart: "Listen to Him. "May we listen in silence, in Scripture, in the Eucharist, and in the cries of those in need. And may we, through prayer and trust, be transformed into the people God calls us to be.


