"REJOICE, O JERUSALEM! BE JOYFUL, ALL WHO WERE IN MOURNING!" (ISAIAH 66: 10)

The Fourth Sunday of Lent, traditionally called Laetare Sunday, is a time of joyful anticipation amidst our Lenten journey. Today's readings call us to reflect on transformation, reconciliation, and the boundless mercy of God. We are reminded that we are all on a journey back to the Father. No matter how far we have strayed, no matter how broken our past, God calls us home. Will we respond?

FIRST READING: JOSHUA 5:9A, 10-12 - A NEW BEGINNING

"The Lord said to Joshua, 'Today I have rolled away from you the disgrace of Egypt.'"

After forty years of wandering, the Israelites finally enter the Promised Land. Their long exile in the wilderness has ended, and for the first time, they eat the produce of the land instead of manna. This marks a profound moment: their identity is no longer that of slaves but of a free people in covenant with God.

Lent is our own journey of leaving behind our "Egypt"—our past sins, failures, and regrets. The Lord wants to "roll away" our disgrace and lead us to a deeper trust in Him.

SECOND READING: 2 CORINTHIANS 5:17-21 - BECOMING NEW IN CHRIST

"If anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away."

St. Paul reminds us that reconciliation is at the heart of our faith. We are not merely sinners trying to do better—we are new creations in Christ! Through His sacrifice, Christ has reconciled us to the Father and given us the ministry of reconciliation.

This means that Lent is not only a time to seek God's forgiveness but also to extend it to others. Is there someone we need to forgive? Is there a relationship that needs healing? Reconciliation is not just an individual act—it is the mission of the Church.

GOSPEL: LUKE 15:1-3, 11-32 - THE FATHER WHO RUNS TO US

The Parable of the Prodigal Son is a story of rebellion, repentance, and redemption. But at its core, it is a story of the Father's unconditional love.

The younger son, blinded by pride, demands his inheritance, squanders it, and falls into misery. The elder son, though outwardly obedient, harbors resentment. Yet, the heart of the parable is the Father—watching, waiting, and running to embrace his lost child.


This Lent, we are invited to examine our hearts. Are we like the younger son, lost in sin but afraid to return? Or are we like the elder son, dutiful but bitter? The Father calls both to the same banquet.

God does not wait passively for our return—He runs to meet us. Will we let Him embrace us?

As we enter this final stretch of Lent, let us rejoice in the mercy of God. Let us embrace the freedom He offers and welcome the grace of reconciliation. Whether we see ourselves in the prodigal son or the elder brother, the Father's invitation remains the same: "Everything I have is yours. Come and share in My joy."


