

Lent: A Season to Let Go, Receive Mercy, and Begin Anew

At St. John Vianney today, we celebrate the Third Scrutiny with our RCIA candidates, praying for their continued conversion and strength. While the liturgy uses the Year A readings, this bulletin offers a personal reflection on the Year C readings for the Fifth Sunday of Lent—a reminder that Lent is not a time to remain trapped in the past, but a time to embrace mercy and move forward in hope.

1. Let Go of the Past—So God Can Work Anew

Isaiah 43:16–21 speaks to a people in exile, weary and stuck in spiritual stagnation. Through the prophet, God calls His people to stop clinging to what was and to open their hearts to what can be: "I am about to do a new thing."

Lent is not a season of regret, but of liberation. God longs to make streams flow in the desert places of our lives to renew relationships, heal past wounds, and awaken dry souls.

Ask yourself: What part of your life feels like a desert? Will you let God bring it to life again?

2. Strain Forward to What Lies Ahead

In Philippians 3:8–14, St. Paul speaks with the voice of a man transformed. He lets go of past attachments—good and bad—and presses on in pursuit of Christ: "Forgetting what lies behind, I strain forward to what lies ahead."

What are you still clinging to? Past failures, old wounds, a need for control, or even comfort zones that keep you from growing?

Lent is the time to release those weights and run toward Easter with hope.

3. Mercy That Stoops, Lifts, and Transforms

John 8:1–11 tells the story of the woman caught in adultery—dragged into the temple, shamed, and surrounded by condemnation. But Jesus, the face of divine mercy, stoops down. He silences her accusers and lifts her up: "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and sin no more."

This is Lent in one moment: not punishment, but mercy; not shame, but restoration.

Jesus does not condone sin—but He never stops loving the sinner. He lifts us so we can walk again.

Practical Takeaways for Daily Life

1. Experience Mercy Personally

Have you gone to Confession this Lent? It's not about guilt—it's about grace. Don't let fear steal the joy of forgiveness.

2. Drop the Stone

Is there someone you're still judging or resenting? Lent is the time to let go of that weight. Forgiveness frees you too.

3. Walk with Others in Mercy

Many in our parish carry hidden wounds or feel judged. Let's become a parish that accompanies rather than accuses—offering mercy, not condemnation.

No matter where you've been, it's not too late. Christ is near. He stoops to meet you. He is ready to write a new chapter in your life. Will you let Him?

Holy Martyr's of Japan Parish in Bradford will be hosting a Lenten Retreat


