"FEED MY SHEEP": EASTER RENEWAL IN ACTION

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

The Easter season is a beautiful time of **renewal and mission**, and today's readings stir our hearts to live with **courageous faith**, **humble love**, **and bold witness**. In these weeks of Easter joy, the Church does not allow us to remain idle; instead, we are called—like Peter and the apostles—to rise up and **proclaim Christ's resurrection** in word and deed, in our homes, workplaces, and community.

1. Called to Witness: Strength in the Face of Opposition

In our **First Reading (Acts 5.28-32, 40b-41)**, we see Peter and the apostles standing before the authorities, boldly declaring: "We must obey God rather than human authority." Despite being flogged and warned, they leave "rejoicing that they were considered worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name."

This is **the mark of a true disciple**—someone who bears witness, even when it's hard or inconvenient. As St. Teresa of Calcutta wisely said:

"God does not require that we be successful, only that we be faithful."

Today, many of us face quieter but no less real challenges: standing up for truth in the workplace, showing integrity when it costs us something, or living out our faith in a society that can seem indifferent or even hostile. The apostles remind us: **our joy** is not in worldly success but in faithfulness to Christ.

2. The Cosmic Vision: Christ, Worthy of Praise

The **Second Reading (Revelation 5.11-14)** lifts our eyes from the trials of earth to the **heavenly throne room**, where countless angels proclaim:

"Worthy is the Lamb that was slaughtered to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing!"

This vision reminds us that **our worship connects us to the entire cosmos.** Every time we come to Mass, we join this great chorus of praise. Amid life's worries, this reading helps us remember: **Christ reigns.** He is victorious. He is worthy of our trust.

St. Augustine once said:

"To sing is to pray twice."

Let us continue to bring all we are—joys and sorrows—into the Eucharist, uniting ourselves with the Lamb who gives us hope and strength.

3. Love Restored: Peter's Redemption and Our Call

In the **Gospel (John 21.1-19)**, we meet Jesus on the shore of the Sea of Tiberias, where He lovingly restores Peter after his denial. Three times Jesus asks Peter, "Do you love me?" and three times Peter responds, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." With each affirmation, Jesus commissions him:

"Feed my lambs... Tend my sheep... Feed my sheep."

This is a Gospel of restoration and commissioning. Peter, broken and ashamed, finds mercy and a new mission. How often in our own lives do we feel like failures in faith—through sins, weaknesses, or discouragement? But Jesus never tires of calling us back, healing us, and entrusting us again with His work.

As Pope Francis reminds us:

"The Lord never tires of forgiving. It is we who tire of asking for forgiveness."

Every one of us has a role in tending Christ's flock. Whether it's through parenting, caring for an elderly parent, mentoring a colleague, or simply offering a listening ear, we are shepherds in the small and great tasks of daily life.

Bringing It Home: What Does This Mean for Us Today?

- Faithfulness Over Fear: Like the apostles, let's prioritize faith over fearin our decisions, even when it's countercultural.
- **Praise that Sustains:** Let's make our participation in the Mass more intentional, remembering we are part of a cosmic chorus of worship.
- **Shepherding in Small Ways:** Each of us is called to "feed the sheep" around us. This week, ask: Who needs my kindness? Who is God asking me to serve or encourage?

As we continue our Easter journey, may today's message inspire each of us to embrace our calling with **renewed courage and love.** Let's walk forward, remembering these words of St. John Paul II:

"Do not be afraid. Open wide the doors for Christ."


