"LOVE ONE ANOTHER. JUST AS I HAVE LOVED YOU." — JOHN 13:34

Easter is not merely a season; it is the soul of the Church's life. As we journey through the Fifth Sunday of Easter, the Word of God this weekend invites us into the very heart of Christian discipleship: love made visible, love that suffers, and love that renews.

First Reading - Acts 14.21b-27

"It is through many persecutions that we must enter the kingdom of God." St. Paul's missionary journeys, marked by trials and hardships, show us that the road of faith is not always easy, but it is always fruitful. Christian life is not a promise of comfort but a call to courage, perseverance, and hope. Even amid suffering, the early Church "reported all that God had done with them." This is our model: to recount the good even while bearing the burdens.

Second Reading - Revelation 21.1-5a "See, the home of God is among mortals."

This breathtaking vision from Revelation speaks of a new heaven and a new earth. In the Resurrection of Christ, that newness has already begun. God is not distant — He pitches His tent among us. Every act of charity, every healing word, every act of mercy participates in God's work of making all things new. For those grieving, struggling, or longing for hope, this is your promise: God is with you, and He is making all things new — including you.

Gospel – John 13.1, 31-33a, 34-35 "Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another."

These are some of Jesus' final words before His Passion — a new commandment, a new ethic for a renewed humanity. The commandment to love is not "new" in time, but in quality: we are now to love as Jesus loves — sacrificially, unconditionally, and enduringly.

The love of Christ is not reactive but proactive. He loves first, even those who will betray and deny Him. To love like Christ is to choose mercy when it's easier to judge, to serve when it's easier to retreat, and to forgive when it's easier to resent. This is not optional. Jesus says: "By this everyone will know you are my disciples."

LIVING THE COMMANDMENT OF LOVE

This week's readings are not merely for inspiration — they are a call to conversion in daily life. We are asked to be builders of communion in our families, workplaces, schools, and parish. Here are some ways we might live this Easter call:

- Forgive a long-standing hurt Let love break the cycle of bitterness.
- Spend time with someone who is lonely or grieving — Your presence may be Christ's healing for them.
- Support someone in difficulty A listening ear or small act of help can be a sign of God's nearness.
- Welcome newcomers In our church and community, may no one feel like a stranger.

"A Christian is never alone. Christ is always with us, and in Him, we are one Body." – Catechism of the Catholic Church, 787–795




