THE ASCENSION: CHRIST EXALTED, MISSION ENTRUSTED

The Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord marks a profound moment in salvation history—forty days after Easter, Christ ascends into heaven, not to abandon us, but to lift humanity toward God. In the words of Pope St. Leo the Great, "Christ's ascension is our uplifting, and the hope of the Body is raised where the glory of the Head has gone before." Today's celebration is not an ending, but a beginning: the beginning of the Church's mission in the world.

The Mystery of the Ascension: Glorified Yet Present

The Gospel of Luke tells us that before ascending, Jesus opens the minds of the disciples to understand the Scriptures, commissioning them as witnesses to repentance and forgiveness "beginning from Jerusalem" (Luke 24:47). Then, He blesses them and is "carried up into heaven" (v. 51). Unlike a farewell, this is an empowerment.

In Acts 1:1–11, Luke narrates again how Jesus is "lifted up," and the disciples stand gazing into the sky until two angels confront them: "Why do you stand looking up?" This gentle rebuke is the hinge between contemplation and mission. We are not called merely to adore, but to act—carrying Christ's light into a world often shadowed by confusion, loneliness, and despair.

St. Augustine wrote, "You ascended before our eyes, and we turned back grieving, only to find You in our hearts." Though Christ is enthroned in glory, He is also mystically and sacramentally present in His Church, especially in the Eucharist and in the lives of believers. His physical departure makes way for a more intimate presence through the Holy Spirit.

The Eyes of the Heart Enlightened

St. Paul, writing to the Ephesians, prays "that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened" (Eph. 1:18). What a beautiful image: a heart that sees! In a world driven by external metrics of success and fleeting digital images, Paul invites us to perceive deeper realities—"the hope to which he has called you," and "the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe" (vv. 18–19).

The same power that raised Christ from the dead and seated Him "at the right hand" (v. 20) is alive in the Church. The Ascension does not render Jesus distant; rather, He now reigns above every worldly power, and yet dwells in every willing heart. Theologian Hans Urs von Balthasar described the Ascension as "Christ's cosmic embrace of creation," gathering all things into divine life.

From Gaze to Mission: A Life Transformed

Consider the everyday believer—the parent who teaches the faith at home, the caregiver who shows love to the sick, the young person discerning purpose, or the senior who quietly offers decades of prayer. Each one, by baptism, shares in Christ's ascended life and mission. The Ascension reminds us that our true destiny is not merely earthly security, but divine union. And our calling is not passive waiting but faithful witnessing.

St. John Paul II said, "The Ascension directs our gaze to heaven, to show us that the ultimate goal of our journey is the Father." But the way to the Father runs through our streets, our workplaces, our homes—wherever the Gospel can be lived, spoken, and shown in love.

An Invitation to Hope and Action

In a time marked by global unrest, social isolation, and rapid change, the Ascension proclaims an unshakable truth: Christ reigns, and we are His witnesses. Our task is not to "stand looking up" in paralysis or nostalgia, but to live now as citizens of heaven, loving this world into healing and holiness.

As we celebrate the Ascension, let us remember the final words of Jesus: "You are witnesses of these things... I am sending upon you what my Father promised" (Luke 24:48–49). The Spirit will come. Until then, let us wait in joyful hope—and get to work.

"Let us then be on our way with hearts lifted high, for where the Head has gone in glory, the Body is called to follow in hope." —St. Leo the Great




