

THE MISSION AND THE JOY OF DISCIPLESHIP

There is a quiet power in being sent. A young teacher sent into her first classroom. A parent releasing a child into the world. A missionary walking into a distant village with nothing but the Gospel and trust in God. Today's readings open our hearts to the beautiful truth that every baptized Christian is "sent", called to carry the peace, healing, and joy of the Lord to the world, beginning in the ordinary corners of life.

In the Gospel of Luke this Sunday, Jesus appoints seventy others and sends them out two by two. It is a moment of trust and empowerment. These are not the Twelve Apostles, but ordinary followers like you and me. This broader group reminds us that mission is not reserved for the religious or the ordained. As the Catechism teaches, "the whole Church is missionary, and the work of evangelization is a basic duty of the People of God" (CCC 1305).

Jesus does not send them out with wealth or weapons, but with vulnerability. "Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals" (Luke 10:4). They are to rely on God and on the hospitality of others. They are to proclaim peace, not judgment. And when rejected, they are not to retaliate but to move on in peace. How countercultural this is in our world of retaliation, outrage, and self-promotion.

St. Ambrose once said, "He who has peace in his heart carries heaven with him wherever he goes." In being sent, the seventy carried that peace to the homes and villages they visited. They were, in a real sense, "mobile tabernacles" of God's presence. And so are we. In our homes, offices, schools, and supermarkets, we are sent to bring light into shadows, calm into conflict, and Christ into the everyday.

In the first reading from Isaiah 66, we hear a tender image of Jerusalem nursing her children. God's care is like a mother comforting a child: "As a mother

comforts her child, so I will comfort you" (Isaiah 66:13). This maternal care is also our model in mission. We are sent not to dominate or debate, but to console, to build, and to offer the Gospel as one offers a cup of water to the thirsty.

Saint Teresa of Calcutta understood this well. When asked what her mission was, she said, "I am a little pencil in the hand of a writing God, who is sending a love letter to the world." Each of us is part of that message, written not in ink but in kindness, sacrifice, and hope.

Paul, in his letter to the Galatians (6:14-18), reminds us that our only boast is in the Cross of Christ. True Christian joy flows from surrender, not status. Our mission is not to make ourselves known but to make Christ known. Not to draw attention to ourselves, but to Him who gave Himself for us.

As a parish, let us rediscover the joy of being sent, not as burdened servants but as joyful messengers. Let our families be places of peace. Let our conversations sow grace. Let our daily lives become a mission field where Christ is announced through our actions, our mercy, and our love.

And when we feel weak, overwhelmed, or unworthy, let us remember: Christ does not wait until we are perfect. He calls us as we are and transforms us along the way. He does not say, "Be ready before you go," but simply, "Go... I am sending you" (Luke 10:3)

We are the seventy. We are sent, even today, into our neighborhoods, schools, families, and workplaces. Like the disciples, we go in vulnerability, yet with the strength of the Lord. Our mission is not success, but faithfulness. Our message is peace. Our joy is Christ.

May we go forth with His peace and return with joy, rejoicing that even in our weakness, God is doing great things through us.

Tip Tap Pay for Offertory


This weekend we are launching our new "Tip Tap to Give" initiative. This


