THE CALL TO TRUE DISCIPLESHIP: COUNTING THE COST

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Word of God this Sunday (Wisdom 9:13–18; Philemon 9–10, 12–17; Luke 14:25–33) speaks directly to the heart of what it means to follow Christ in the real, daily struggles of our lives. Jesus does not sugarcoat discipleship. He tells the large crowd: "Whoever does not carry the cross and follow me cannot be my disciple" (Luke 14:27). These words challenge us deeply, but they also invite us into a more authentic freedom and joy.

Wisdom and the Mystery of God's Ways

The first reading from the Book of Wisdom reminds us that human understanding is limited: "For the reasoning of mortals is worthless, and our designs are likely to fail" (Wis. 9:14). St. Augustine once wrote, "We are talking about God. What wonder is it if you do not understand? For if you do understand, it is not God you understand." True discipleship begins with humility: acknowledging that we cannot grasp everything about God's plan, but we can entrust our lives to Him.

The Cost of Following Jesus

In today's Gospel, Jesus asks us to "count the cost" of discipleship. This is not to discourage us, but to help us recognize that following Him requires real commitment. Dietrich Bonhoeffer, the great theologian, called this "the cost of discipleship." He warned against what he called "cheap grace," a faith that demands nothing. Instead, he says, "When Christ calls a man, he bids him come and die."

For us today, this "dying" often means letting go of selfishness, resentments, or comforts that prevent us from fully loving God and neighbor. Parents know this cost when they sacrifice time and energy for their children. Workers know it when they choose integrity over convenience. Young people know it when they stand for what is right among peers. Each of us is invited to ask: What cross am I called to carry in my discipleship?

The Letter to Philemon: A Lesson in Christian Brotherhood

St. Paul's short but powerful letter to Philemon shows what Christian discipleship looks like in real relationships. Paul appeals to Philemon to welcome Onesimus, not as a slave, but as a brother in Christ. The Gospel changes human ties, it transforms master and servant into brothers, strangers into family. In a world marked by division and exclusion, the Church is called to be a home where all are welcomed as beloved children of God.

A Word for Today

In our present times, when life can feel burdensome and uncertain, Jesus reminds us that discipleship is not a half-hearted affair. He does not ask for perfection but for wholehearted trust. To be His disciple is to place Him above all else; not to diminish our love for family, but to deepen it. By putting Christ first, all our other loves find their proper meaning.

As Pope Francis reminds us: "Discipleship is not a program, but a continual following of Jesus who loves us, forgives us, and always walks with us."


