# THE CROSS: FROM SIGN OF DEFEAT TO TREE OF LIFE

Dear Parish Family,

On this September 14, Holy Mother Church invites us to celebrate the Feast of the *Exaltation of the Holy Cross*. At first glance, the very idea seems paradoxical: how can we "exalt" an instrument of shame, torture, and death? And yet, for us Christians, the Cross is not a mark of defeat but the throne of glory, the tree of victory, and the sign of our salvation. As St. John Chrysostom so powerfully reminds us: "The Cross is the trophy of Christ's victory, the annihilation of death, and the hope of Christians."

### Scripture and the Mystery of the Cross

The Liturgy of the Word leads us to the heart of this mystery. In the Book of Numbers (21:4–9), the Israelites, bitten by serpents, are healed when they gaze upon the bronze serpent Moses raised on a pole. This foreshadowing reveals a profound truth: healing does not come from human strength but from turning our eyes in faith toward the One who is lifted up for our salvation.

In the Gospel of John (3:13–17), Jesus Himself makes the connection clear: "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in Him may have eternal life." His crucifixion, far from being a tragic end, is the very moment when God's redeeming love is revealed in its fullness. The Cross, then, is not the conclusion of a sorrowful story, but the gateway to eternal life.

### The Cross in the Teaching of the Church

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches: "The cross is the unique sacrifice of Christ, the 'one mediator between God and men'" (CCC 618). In it we see both the depth of human sin and, more importantly, the immeasurable love of God. St. John Paul II once described the Cross as "a living book from which we continually learn who God is and how much He loves us."

The Church Fathers often spoke of the Cross as the *Tree of Life*. Where Adam and Eve stretched out their hands in disobedience, Christ stretched out His arms in perfect obedience. Where the first tree brought death, the Cross brings eternal life. St. Augustine captures it beautifully: "The death of the Lord our God should not be a cause of shame for us; rather, it should be our greatest hope, our greatest glory."

### The Cross and Our Daily Life

But what does this mystery mean for us today, in our families, our work, our struggles?

Every one of us carries crosses: illness, family difficulties, financial burdens, loneliness, or the weight of personal weakness. Often, like the Israelites in the desert, we are tempted to complain, to lose heart. Yet the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross invites us to see differently. When united with Christ, our crosses are not meaningless, they become redemptive.

Think of the parent who gives tirelessly for the good of their children, the caregiver who carries the suffering of another with compassion, or the elderly person who unites their aches and loneliness with the Passion of Christ. These hidden sacrifices, embraced with love, are transformed into instruments of grace.

Jesus does not ask us to glorify suffering in itself; rather, He invites us to discover in it the path of love. "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross daily, and follow me" (Luke 9:23).

### A Message of Hope

In a world that avoids pain and seeks comfort at all costs, the Cross stands as both contradiction and promise. It declares that God can transform even the darkest moments into light, and the deepest wounds into fountains of grace. The Cross proclaims forever that love is stronger than death.

As we gather at the altar this Sunday, let us lift our eyes to the Cross, not as a relic of the past but as the living sign of God's saving power. May it strengthen us in trials, console us in sorrow, and guide us in hope. For beyond every Good Friday, the light of Easter morning always awaits.

May the Cross of Christ be our strength, our hope, and our everlasting glory.




