

### THE GREAT REVERSAL: LIVING HEAVEN'S PRIORITIES TODAY

This Sunday's readings (Amos 6:1a, 4–7; Psalm 146; 1 Timothy 6:11–16; Luke 16:19–31) confront us with a sobering truth: God's Kingdom is not measured by worldly wealth, prestige, or comfort, but by love, justice, and fidelity. The Word of God invites us to examine where our hearts truly rest, whether in temporary riches or in eternal hope.

#### The Prophet's Warning

The prophet Amos cries out against complacency and self-indulgence: "Alas for those who are at ease in Zion... who lie on beds of ivory... but are not grieved over the ruin of Joseph" (Amos 6:1, 4, 6). His words denounce the blindness of those who live comfortably while ignoring the suffering of their brothers and sisters. St. John Chrysostom once remarked, "Not to share one's wealth with the poor is to steal from them and to take away their livelihood. It is not our own goods which we hold, but theirs."

How strikingly relevant this is in our own time. Surrounded by abundance, many are tempted to indifference. Our society often measures success by possessions and achievements, but Scripture reminds us that every gift is entrusted for service.

#### The Gospel: Lazarus at Our Door

In today's Gospel (Luke 16:19–31), Jesus offers the parable of the rich man and Lazarus. The contrast is sharp: one feasts splendidly while the other starves, his sores licked by dogs. After death, however, the tables turn; the poor man is comforted in Abraham's bosom, while the rich man suffers torment.

This is not merely a story about "the afterlife," but a piercing critique of how we live here and now. Pope Francis, in Evangelii Gaudium (2013), reminds us: "The Gospel tells us constantly to run the risk of a face-to-face encounter with others... with their pain and their pleas" (§88). The tragedy of the rich man is not his wealth, but his failure to see Lazarus, to recognize the humanity of the one at his gate.

How often do we, too, step over the "Lazaruses" in our lives, those in need of food, dignity, attention, or companionship? Sometimes Lazarus is not materially poor, but lonely, sick, or excluded. The parable becomes a mirror for our own blindness.

#### St. Paul: Pursue True Riches

In the Second Reading, St. Paul exhorts Timothy: "Pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance, gentleness" (1 Tim 6:11). Here is the real treasure that endures beyond death. Christian discipleship demands vigilance against greed, cultivating instead virtues that align us with Christ.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches: "The Lord grieves over the rich, because they find their consolation in the abundance of goods... The Lord enjoins His disciples to prefer Him to everything and everyone" (CCC 2547). In short, we are called to live for what lasts.

#### Today's Call: Seeing with Christ's Eyes

#### This Sunday challenges each of us:

- Do I recognize the Lazarus at my doorstep? It could be a neighbor struggling silently, a family member longing for reconciliation, or the poor in our community and world.
- Do I use my gifts for service? Stewardship is not about loss, but about blessing – discovering the joy of giving.
- Do I seek heaven's priorities? Prayer, simplicity, and acts of mercy align our hearts with God's eternal vision.

St. Teresa of Calcutta often said, "If you can't feed a hundred people, then feed just one." The Kingdom of God begins in small acts of love that echo into eternity.

#### Living the Great Reversal

The readings this week reveal a "great reversal"; those ignored on earth are exalted in heaven. This is not meant to frighten us, but to awaken us. God desires that our lives bear witness to His mercy.

Let us then ask the Lord to open our eyes, to see Christ in the poor, the suffering, and the forgotten. Let us pursue the riches of faith, hope, and love, so that when our journey ends, we may hear those blessed words: "Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you" (Mt 25:34).

#### Practical Invitation for the Week:

- Take time to notice someone you might usually overlook. Offer a word, a gesture, or concrete help.
- Reflect on your "riches"—whether talents, resources, or time—and ask how they can serve others.
- Pray with Psalm 146: "The Lord lifts up those who are bowed down; the Lord loves the righteous."




