## "LORD, INCREASE OUR FAITH!"

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

The cry of the Apostles in today's Gospel (Luke 17:5–10) is our cry as well: "Lord, increase our faith!" They recognized that discipleship is not merely about following external rules, but about living a deep interior trust in God that sustains us through trials, doubts, and moments of weakness.

## Faith as a Living Relationship

Faith is not just intellectual assent to doctrines; it is a living relationship with God rooted in trust and obedience. The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us: "Faith is first of all a personal adherence of man to God" (CCC 150). St. Thomas Aquinas explained that faith perfects the intellect by uniting it to divine truth. It is both a gift and a task, something we receive and something we must nurture.

Jesus uses the striking image of the mustard seed: even faith as small as this can uproot a mulberry tree. In other words, authentic faith; though seemingly small, possesses an immense transformative power when joined to God's will. It is not the "size" of our faith, but the sincerity of our trust in God that matters.

## Living Faith in the Midst of Life's Challenges

Today many of us feel overwhelmed by uncertainties: economic instability, divisions in families, health struggles, or anxieties about the future. Like the Apostles, we may feel that our faith is too small for the challenges we face. But the Lord encourages us: even the smallest seed of faith, if nurtured, can move what seems immovable.

Think of a parent caring tirelessly for a sick child, or a caregiver tending to an elderly parent, or a worker who continues to act with honesty despite pressures to compromise. These daily acts of fidelity, often hidden and uncelebrated, are where faith comes alive. They remind us that true discipleship is about trust, service, and perseverance.

#### Servants of the Lord

The second part of today's Gospel can sound harsh: "We are worthless servants; we have done only what we ought to have done." (Luke 17:10). Yet

Jesus is teaching us humility. Faith leads not to pride or entitlement, but to the joyful realization that all we are and all we accomplish is pure gift. St. Augustine beautifully said: "When God rewards our merits, He crowns His own gifts."

Christian faith is lived not in heroic gestures alone but in the ordinary fidelity of prayer, family love, sacrificial giving, and daily work. Pope Francis reminds us in Evangelii Gaudium that every disciple is called to be "a missionary disciple" in the small details of everyday life.

## A Call for Our Parish Today

As a parish family at St. John Vianney, we are invited to renew our trust in the Lord. Let us not be discouraged by our weaknesses or the challenges of our times. Instead, let us echo the prayer of the Apostles with confidence: "Lord, increase our faith!"

Faith grows when exercised. It grows in prayer, in the Eucharist, in acts of forgiveness, in service to the poor, and in the courage to live the Gospel in our workplaces, schools, and homes. Like a mustard seed, it may appear small—but in God's hands, it bears fruit beyond measure.

## **Closing Prayer**

May we, as humble servants of Christ, live our faith with courage and simplicity. And may the words of St. Paul today inspire us: "Guard the good treasure entrusted to you, with the help of the Holy Spirit living in us" (2 Timothy 1:14).

Let us move forward together, trusting not in the size of our faith, but in the greatness of our God.
