THE PRAYER THAT TOUCHES HEAVEN: HUMILITY BEFORE GOD

Dear beloved parishioners of St. John Vianney,

As we gather on this Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Word of God invites us into the heart of true prayer; the kind that rises to Heaven not because of eloquence or self-assurance, but because it springs from humility, honesty, and trust in God's mercy.

In today's Gospel (Luke 18:9–14), Jesus offers a timeless parable of two men who went up to the Temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee's prayer was filled with self-praise and comparison: "God, I thank you that I am not like other people." Yet the tax collector, standing far off, simply cried out, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." And Jesus tells us that this man went home justified, for, "all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted."

1. The God Who Listens to the Humble

The first reading from the Book of Sirach (Sir 35:15–17, 20, 22) assures us that "The prayer of the humble pierces the clouds." God, who shows no partiality, listens not to the proud but to the cry of the poor, the orphan, and the widow. This truth reminds us that before God, all human status disappears. What matters is the sincerity of our hearts.

St. Augustine once said, "It was pride that changed angels into devils; it is humility that makes men as angels." The humble soul recognizes both the greatness of God and the frailty of one's own heart. In a world that often glorifies self-sufficiency and success, we are called instead to the humility of the tax collector, a humility that allows grace to flow.

2. Running the Good Race with Faith

In the second reading, St. Paul writes his moving farewell in the Letter to Timothy (2 Tim 4:6–8, 16–18). He sees his life as a "libation being poured out," and he speaks with confidence, not in himself, but in God who has never abandoned him:

"The Lord stood by me and gave me strength... The Lord will rescue me from every evil attack and save me for his heavenly kingdom."

Paul's words are a testimony of perseverance; a model for every Christian who faces struggles, doubts, or loneliness. Like Paul, we are each invited to run the race of faith with humility, trusting that the "crown of righteousness" awaits those who love the Lord.

In our lives, where personal achievement often overshadows spiritual depth, Paul reminds us that our

ultimate victory lies not in what we do, but in who we become, faithful servants shaped by God's grace.

3. The Humble Prayer that Heals the Heart

The contrast between the Pharisee and the tax collector remains a mirror for every soul. We, too, can fall into the subtle temptation of the Pharisee... comparing, judging, or trying to earn God's love. True prayer begins when we stop performing before God and start being real with Him.

Pope Francis beautifully said, "Prayer that is humble and confident is the one that opens the heart to the Lord." The tax collector's few words, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner", form the foundation of Christian spirituality. They echo in the Jesus Prayer cherished by the saints: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner."

Humility does not degrade us; it sets us free. When we acknowledge our weakness, God fills the emptiness with His mercy.

4. October: The Month of Our Blessed Mother

As we reflect on humility, we cannot fail to look toward Mary, our Blessed Mother, the humble handmaid of the Lord. In this month of October, dedicated to her, we show our special love and devotion by praying the Holy Rosary.

5. November: Remembering Our Faithful Departed

As we approach the month of November, our hearts turn in loving remembrance to all the faithful departed; our family members, friends, and parishioners who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith.

I warmly invite everyone to join in this sacred commemoration, a moment of prayer, hope, and communion with those who have entered eternal rest. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 1032) teaches: "From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them." Our prayers, offered in love, are a gift that unites heaven and earth.

Dear friends, today's readings gently but firmly call us to look within. We are invited to pray not with pride, but with purity; not with self-assurance, but with surrender. The humble heart finds peace because it trusts that God hears, understands, and loves completely.

May the Lord grant us the grace to pray like the tax collector, to persevere like St. Paul, and to trust like Mary. Then we too will go home "justified," carried by the mercy of God whose love pierces the clouds.
