THE HOLY FAMILY, OUR SCHOOL OF LOVE, FAITH, AND HOPE

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, we are invited to contemplate not an idealized family free from struggle, but a real family who trusted God amid uncertainty, fear, displacement, and silent obedience. In gazing upon the Holy Family, we discover God's plan for our own families, and for our parish family here at St. John Vianney.

The Book of Sirach reminds us that family life is sacred ground, a place where God's blessing flows through love, respect, and mercy. "Whoever honours father and mother is gladdened by children, and when he prays he is heard" (Sirach 3:5). These words affirm that caring for one another across generations is not merely a social responsibility but a holy act that pleases God. In a world that often undervalues family bonds, Scripture calls us back to reverence, patience, forgiveness, and gratitude, especially toward the elderly and the vulnerable.

Saint Paul, writing to the Colossians, brings this wisdom into daily Christian living. He urges us to "put on compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience" (Colossians 3:12). These are not abstract virtues; they are lived out in kitchens and living rooms, in moments of misunderstanding, sacrifice, and reconciliation. The Christian family becomes holy not because it is perfect, but because Christ dwells within it. As the Catechism teaches, the family is the "domestic Church," a first place of faith, prayer, and love (CCC 1655–1658). When families pray together, forgive one another, and persevere through trials, they mirror the life of Christ himself.

The Gospel presents the Holy Family not in comfort, but in flight. Joseph, attentive to God's voice, rises in the night and leads his family into Egypt to escape danger. This moment reveals the quiet heroism of Saint Joseph, a man of action rooted in trust. Pope Benedict XVI once described Joseph as a man who

"knows how to listen to God, and allows himself to be guided by His will." Joseph teaches us that holiness often unfolds in silence, obedience, and courageous responsibility.

This Gospel speaks powerfully to our own time. Many today live with uncertainty about the future, carry heavy family responsibilities, face fear, illness, or displacement, or discern difficult vocational decisions. Some among us are far from their families this Christmas season, newcomers, students, workers, or those separated by distance, loss, or circumstance. To you especially, I wish to say, you are not alone. Your parish is your family. Here at St. John Vianney, we walk together, pray together, and carry one another in faith. As Saint Augustine reminds us, "You have made us for Yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You." In Christ, we find a home that no distance can take away.

As the year 2025 draws to a close, we pause to praise the Lord for the countless blessings we have received, for moments of grace often unseen, for growth through joy and through sorrow. We also remember with tenderness all the losses of this past year, loved ones who have gone before us, dreams that changed, and burdens quietly borne. We place all of it into the loving hands of God, trusting that He brings life even from pain.

As we welcome the New Year, may the Lord bless each of you with a grace-filled 2026, with good health, good news, renewed faith, and lasting joy in your family and personal lives. May our homes become places of prayer, forgiveness, and hope. May our families become Holy Families, shaped by love, guided by trust, and strengthened by Christ who is Emmanuel, God with us.


