**BELOVED AND SENT:
REMEMBERING WHO WE ARE AT
THE WATERS OF BAPTISM**

Dear Parish Family of St. John Vianney,

As we conclude the Christmas season, the Church invites us to stand once more at the waters of the Jordan and to contemplate a mystery that touches the very heart of our Christian identity, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. What we celebrate today is not only an event in the life of Jesus, but a revelation of who God is and who we are called to be.

In the Gospel according to Matthew, Jesus approaches John the Baptist and asks to be baptized. John hesitates, knowing his own unworthiness. Yet Jesus insists, saying, "Let it be so now, for it is proper for us in this way to fulfill all righteousness" (Matthew 3:15). The sinless Son of God steps into the waters not because He needs cleansing, but because He chooses solidarity. He enters fully into our human story, into our vulnerability, our brokenness, and our longing for new life.

As Jesus rises from the water, the heavens are opened, the Spirit descends like a dove, and the Father's voice is heard, "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased" (Matthew 3:17). This is not only a declaration about Jesus, it is a revelation meant for us. In baptism, these same words are spoken over every Christian life. The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that baptism makes us "a new creature, an adopted son or daughter of God" (CCC 1265). Before we do anything, before we achieve or fail, we are first beloved.

The First Reading from Isaiah deepens this vision. God speaks of His chosen servant, gentle, faithful, and committed to justice, "a light to the nations, to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon" (Isaiah 42:6-7). This servant does not shout or break the bruised reed. How consoling this is for a world and for hearts that are often weary. Many today feel bruised by life, families strained by pressures, young people searching for meaning, elders carrying silent loneliness, and believers who struggle to trust

God amid uncertainty. God does not crush the weak; He restores them. Baptism places us within this mission of quiet but transformative love.

The Second Reading from the Acts of the Apostles reminds us that this gift is for all. Peter proclaims, "God shows no partiality" (Acts 10:34). Jesus, anointed by the Holy Spirit, goes about doing good and healing. Baptism is never a private privilege; it is a public calling. Every baptized person is anointed to bring healing into homes, workplaces, schools, and parish life. Parents do this when they forgive patiently, young people when they choose integrity, caregivers when they show compassion, and those struggling in faith when they keep showing up, even with questions and doubts.

One of the early Church Fathers, Saint Augustine, beautifully reminds us, "Let us rejoice and give thanks that we have become not only Christians, but Christ himself." This does not mean we replace Christ, but that through baptism, His life flows through ours. Our daily choices, words, and attitudes become the place where heaven continues to open.

Dear friends, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord invites us to remember our beginning, to return to the waters where God first called us by name. It reassures those who feel unworthy that God delights in them. It challenges those who have grown comfortable to live their baptism more intentionally. It consoles those who struggle, reminding them that the Spirit still rests upon them.

As we move forward into Ordinary Time, may we live in an extraordinary awareness of who we are, beloved children of God, anointed and sent. May our parish family be a place where others can hear through us the same words spoken at the Jordan, "You are my beloved."
