Second Sunday in Ordinary Time | January
18, 2026

Dear Parish Family of St. John Vianney,

As we step into the rhythm of Ordinary Time, the Church gently invites us to rediscover something extraordinary that often hides in plain sight, our identity and mission as God's beloved people. Today's readings speak with a quiet but compelling clarity, reminding us that before we do anything for God, we belong to God, and from that belonging flows our call to be light for others.

Through the prophet Isaiah, the Lord speaks words that are deeply personal and astonishingly expansive, "You are my servant, Israel, in whom I will be glorified... I will give you as a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth" (Isaiah 49:3,6). These words were first spoken to Israel, yet they echo across generations and land in our own lives today. God calls his servant by name, shapes him with care, and then sends him outward, not for self-glory but for the salvation of the world. Many of us know what it feels like to question our worth or purpose, especially when life feels ordinary, demanding, or even disappointing. Yet Scripture reminds us that God's plans for us are always larger than we imagine, even when our days feel small or unnoticed.

Saint Paul's greeting to the Corinthians reinforces this truth with pastoral tenderness, "To those sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints... Grace to you and peace from God our Father" (1 Corinthians 1:2-3). Paul is writing to a community that is imperfect, divided, and still learning how to live the Gospel. Yet he addresses them not as failures, but as saints in the making. The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that all the baptized share in Christ's priestly, prophetic, and kingly mission (CCC 783). Holiness, then, is not reserved for a few heroic souls, it is the ordinary vocation of every Christian, lived out in families, workplaces, classrooms, parishes, and quiet acts of fidelity.

The Gospel brings us to the banks of the Jordan, where John the Baptist points away from himself and toward Jesus, declaring, "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" (John 1:29). This is more than a title; it is a revelation of who Jesus is and how he saves. He is the Lamb who bears our burdens, our sins, our brokenness, and our fears. John's witness is humble and courageous. He does not cling to attention or status; instead, he teaches us that true discipleship begins by recognizing Christ and helping others recognize him too. In a world hungry for meaning and peace, this simple pointing toward Jesus remains one of the most powerful acts of faith.

For parents raising children, for young people discerning their path, for elders reflecting on a lifetime of faith, and for those quietly struggling or feeling distant from God, today's message is clear and consoling. You are seen by God, called by name, and entrusted with a mission. Even when faith feels fragile or life feels heavy, Christ stands among us as the Lamb who takes away sin and restores hope. As Saint Augustine once wrote, "God loves each of us as if there were only one of us." That love sends us forth, gently but persistently, to be light in our homes, compassion in our communities, and witnesses of grace in an often weary world.

As we continue this Ordinary Time journey, may we listen anew to the voice that calls us, trust the grace that sustains us, and live the mission that has been placed within our hands. What seems ordinary in God's eyes becomes a pathway of salvation.
