

CHOOSE LIFE: A HEART FORMED BY CHRIST

Dear Parishioners,

Every day, often without realizing it, we stand before a quiet but profound choice. In our homes, in our workplaces, in our parish, in our private thoughts, we choose either the path that leads us closer to God or the path that slowly distances us from Him. The readings this Sunday invite us to rediscover the dignity and seriousness of that choice.

In the Book of Sirach we hear these striking words, "If you choose, you can keep the commandments, and to act faithfully is a matter of your own choice" (Sirach 15:15). God places before us "fire and water," life and death, good and evil. He does not force our hand. He respects our freedom.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that freedom is "the power, rooted in reason and will, to act or not to act" and that it attains its perfection when directed toward God. True freedom is not the ability to do anything, it is the grace to choose what is good. How often our culture equates freedom with self assertion, while Scripture reveals freedom as faithful obedience to the Lord.

For parents raising children, this choice appears in small daily decisions, patience instead of anger, presence instead of distraction, prayer instead of indifference. For young people, it may mean choosing integrity when no one is watching. For elders who carry hidden suffering, it may mean choosing trust instead of bitterness. Sirach assures us that God does not command the impossible; He gives grace for what He asks.

Saint Paul deepens this vision in the Second Reading. He speaks of "God's wisdom, secret and hidden, which God decreed before the ages for our glory" (1 Corinthians 2:7). The Christian life is not merely about external rule keeping; it is about entering into the very wisdom of God revealed in Christ. "What no eye has seen, nor ear heard," Paul writes, "these things God has revealed to us through the Spirit."

Here we move from law to love, from obligation to communion. The Holy Spirit forms within us the mind of Christ. Saint Augustine once prayed, "Give what You command, and command what You will." God's commandments are not burdens imposed from outside; they are invitations to participate in divine life.

In the Gospel, Jesus proclaims, "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets; I have come not to abolish but to fulfill" (Matthew 5:17). Then He leads us deeper. It is not enough to avoid murder; we must confront anger. It is not enough to avoid adultery; we must purify the heart. It is not enough to avoid false oaths; our simple "Yes" or "No" must reflect integrity.

Our Lord is not tightening the rules; He is transforming the heart. The law written on stone is now

written within us. Saint John Vianney, our patron, understood this deeply. He knew that holiness is not about external appearance but about a heart converted by grace, a conscience attentive to the whisper of God.

This Gospel challenges us in practical ways. In families, reconciliation cannot be postponed. Jesus tells us to be reconciled with our brother or sister before approaching the altar. In a world of quick words and social media reactions, He calls us to guard our speech. In a culture that trivializes commitment, He invites us to fidelity of heart.

Perhaps some of us feel overwhelmed. The standard seems high. Yet the message is not discouragement, it is hope. God would not call us to holiness without supplying the grace. The Eucharist we celebrate is the very fulfillment of the law of love. Here, Christ gives Himself to us so that we may become what we receive.

At St. John Vianney Parish, as we continue to grow in faith, in sacramental life, in youth engagement, and in deeper devotion, this Sunday reminds us that renewal begins in the heart. The strength of a parish is not measured only in numbers or programs, but in the integrity of its people, men and women whose inner lives are shaped by Christ.

Let us ask the Holy Spirit to enlighten our choices this week. When confronted with impatience, choose charity. When tempted toward resentment, choose forgiveness. When faced with moral confusion, choose truth. Sirach assures us, "He has not commanded anyone to be wicked." Grace is always offered.

May we choose life, choose wisdom, choose Christ; and may our parish become ever more a community where the law of the Lord is fulfilled in love.
